






WORD	DEFINITION	EXAMPLE
economy	the usual or cheapest type of air travel which most air passengers use	The people in economy had a chicken sandwich for their meal, while those in first class had a delicious steak.
business class	a higher level of air travel than economy, but less expensive than first class	He always travels business class when he goes on trips for his company because it is more comfortable than economy.
first class	the highest and most expensive level of air travel with the most comforts	If you travel overseas in first class , your seat turns into a bed and you can sleep easily on the long flight.
destined	directed to a certain place	This plane is destined for Los Angeles.
estimate	to give an opinion about the approximate size, number, length of time, etc.	I estimate that it will take about five hours to walk that distance.
land	to touch ground, to come down to the ground after being in the sky	When the airplane landed , we unfastened our seat belts.
takeoff	leaving the ground	You must fasten your seat belt for takeoff .
securely	safely, tightly, not likely to cause any danger	Make sure the doors and windows are securely locked before you leave.
fasten	to tie, join together, or do up	The flight attendant told us to fasten our seat belts because the flight was going to be bumpy.
upright	straight, not leaning	The airplane seats can lean back, but you must put them in an upright position when you take off and land.
stow	to pack or put away in a small space	The boys stowed their bags under the beds in the small cabin.

WORD	DEFINITION	EXAMPLE
compartment	a place or space to keep things, a separate room or space divided off from a larger structure	He hid the key in a secret compartment in his desk.
cabin	the room or inside of an airplane where the passengers sit	During the long flight, many passengers got out of their seats and walked around the cabin .
oxygen mask	a device used in an airplane to help with breathing if there is a change in air pressure	When the airplane started to bump up and down, the oxygen masks fell from the ceiling and everyone placed them over their faces.
cruising altitude	the height an airplane reaches after takeoff and maintains for most of the flight	You can unfasten your seat belt when the plane reaches its cruising altitude .
equipped	supplied with what is needed, having	I'm renting an apartment in Florida for a month. It is fully furnished and the kitchen is equipped with dishes, pots, pans, etc.
lavatory	a toilet, a bathroom	This is a small plane and it only has one lavatory .
air turbulence	bumpiness or shaking when flying in an airplane	We had to keep our seat belts fastened during the whole flight because there was so much air turbulence .
crew	people working on an airplane, ship, etc.	The members of the crew were all very friendly and helpful, which made our long flight quite enjoyable.
beverage	a drink	Would you like a beverage before you have your dinner?

WORD	DEFINITION	EXAMPLE
complimentary	given free of charge	The drinks were complimentary on the plane, but we had to pay for our sandwiches.
beverage cart	a type of wagon or box with wheels used for carrying drinks	The beverage cart held juice, soft drinks, tea, and coffee.
toast	a wish for happiness, success, etc. made when raising a glass of wine or some other beverage	Let's make a toast to our mother on this special 50th birthday celebration.
marvelous	wonderful	We had a marvelous time at the party and didn't want it to end.
cheers	an expression used when raising glasses and making a toast	On New Year's Eve, at exactly midnight, we raised our glasses and both said " Cheers " at the same time.
